Accordingly, Students A and B shall be provided school accommodations in the town of Thomaston. In the event that Students A and B or the family of Students A and B's circumstances change after the date of the final decision in this matter, the Board reserves the right to consider such circumstances and determine whether the residency of Students A and B or their family has changed and take appropriate action, including but not limited to denying school accommodations and seeking tuition reimbursement, as permitted by Law, from the Parents of Students A and B. Further, the Board authorizes Attorney Grello to communicate in writing the board's decision and the reasons therefore consistent with the board's Executive Session discussion with Students A and B and their parents.
