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Dear Parents and Guardians,

On October 7, 2015, the Connecticut State Board of Education adopted the SAT (created by the College Board) as the annual state assessment for eleventh graders in Connecticut. All students in Connecticut must be tested once in high school for English language arts/ literacy and mathematics using the same assessment for all students. This is a requirement of federal and state law. By adopting the SAT, we are eliminating duplicate testing and eleventh grade students in Connecticut will have an opportunity to take the SAT free of charge during the school day.

The SAT assesses the critical thinking skills students need for academic success. Supports are available for students with special needs, as determined by an individualized education program (IEP) or an Americans with Disabilities Act-Section 504 plan. There will also be accommodations for English Learner (EL) students. Many students will be able to use their SAT scores for both the state school accountability system, as well as college admission (if agreed upon by the student/family and the College Board).

SAT Components:	Reading; Writing and Language; and Mathematics
Connecticut SAT Testing Day:	Wednesday, March 2, 2016, in all Connecticut high schools
Total Testing Time:	3 hours – administration time determined by each high school

Attached is an informational brochure on the SAT produced by the Connecticut State Department of Education. School personnel are being trained in all aspects of administration of the SAT, including supports for students with special needs and English learners.
